baby hatch was launched in Vienna in 2001 to help parents in such hopeless situations. Being able to bring your child to such a safe place, where they are well looked after, is an important socio-political and women's rights achievement that is just as important today as it was 20 years ago.

Two strangers from different cultures meet in absurd circumstances - a Karaoke Bar in Vienna-, as outcasts of society. But their cultural differences give them the space to change their perspective on their personal realities. Their initially bumpy conversation gradually develops into a mutual deep understanding of the importance of accepting oneself independently of social norms, judgments and conventions. This encounter turns the two into accomplices in the confrontation with the volatility of existence.





Suzie is an Austrian-Canadian actress, artist and punk rock singer. She studied at the Stella Adler Studio of Acting Conservatory program and at the Susan Batson Studio with the renowned acting coach herself, both in New York.

In ASTRONAUTS, Suzie plays her first leading role, travelling on the challenging journey of Carla.

Suzie is also the founder of production hub AT-ELIER ORLANDO and the front woman of the American punk rock band WHAT WOULD TILDA SWINTON DO. Her awards and prizes include the Ö1 talent award, the START grant from the Austrian chancellery, the main prize of the Russian Videoart Festival Now and After, the prize for best short in the category "Gender constructions" at the Vienna Women's Film Festival, the Young Female Artist prize of Bildrecht GmbH.

Currently, Suzie is working on several projects. Among them, she plays the leading role in a Brazilian-German Independent film, and is producing a TV show about the extinguished female artists in the women's movement at the turn of the century.



Mariano was born and raised in Buenos

Aires, Argentina, where he studied Theatre and Art History.


He then moved to Paris where he reconnected with his passion for Film and decided to start his studies in Film Making in Prague.

Suzie and Mariano met at the Susan Batson Studio of Acting in New York in the beginning of 2020 and decided to work together. Both of them wanted to create a project that reflects the big topics of gender identity, feminism and cultural disparities narrated in a personal story. It's the first film that Suzie has written and Mariano's 4th one.

After Mariano left New York, they continued writing on ASTRONAUTS from different continents and eventually met up again in Austria for the film shoot with a completely international film team.

For them, it was important to show through the story, how communication between two people can work despite the absence of a common language.

Even a quick encounter - that lasts only for a few minutes- with a complete stranger can change your life 180 degrees. Both characters are outsiders and become accomplices in the confrontation with the volatility of existence, but their cultural differences bring them the space and courage to change their perspective on their personal realities.

Mag. Johann Selikovsky's worked on over 300 films, TV series and documentaries including collaborations with Falco, Queen and the Rolling Stones. He was nominated for a GOLDEN GLOBE, won the PRIX DES BIBLIOTHEQUES, GOLDEN CAMERA AWARD, and the main prize at the CINÉ-

MA DU RÉEL in Paris, among others. Johan Selikovsky produced Ulrich Seidl's debut film Good News, was voted one of the 10 best documentaries worldwide by the festival management under Werner Herzog at the International Documentary Film Festival Amsterdam.

Mimi and Ben are an artist-couple with experience in art direction, photography, production, props and graphic design for low to high budget projects. Besides the work in their film industry, that is a full-time father, plus a consultant of Art Direction to rising film students. Mimi is a professor of Art Direction at Prague Film School and the Film Academy of Miroslav Ondricek in Pisek (FAMO)since 2011.



Petar is a Serbian - Swedish sound maker. He composes for film and theatre, notably Playdurizm (2020), T.E.A.R's (2018) and in collaboration with Mariano Cabaco on his previous short Sonntag (2019). He performs under the musical projects Insert/Airtime, and Polyethylentereftalát.
